

MONDAY, January 13th, 1834

The House met. Present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

The message proposing the appointment of a joint committee upon so much of the Governors Message, as relates to the controversy between this state and the Commonwealth of Virginia, in regard to the southern and western boundary of this state:

Was sent to the senate.

Mr. Evans presented a petition of Hester Egan, of Cecil county, praying relief by county assessment.

Which was read and referred to the standing committee on that subject.

The Speaker laid before the house, a report from the clerk of Montgomery county, shewing the amount of money paid by him into the treasury.

Also, a report from the Inspector of Tobacco Warehouse No. 3, shewing the amount paid by him into the Treasury.

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on ways and means.

On motion by Mr. Palmer,

Ordered, That the committee on Lotteries, be instructed to inquire into the expediency of reducing the number of the Lottery Commissioners to two, and of making it their duty to reside in the city of Baltimore, and report to this house by bill or otherwise.

Mr. Roberts obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, an act relative to appointing a surveyor in Queen Anne's county, to have all the powers of a county surveyor.

Ordered, That Messrs. Roberts, Larrimore and Burgess, report the same.

Mr. Jones of Somerset, obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, an act to provide for the appointment of certain Commissioners in Somerset county.

Ordered, That Messrs. Jones of Somerset, Handy and Long, report the same.

Mr. Hurtt obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, an act to regulate division fences, in Kent county.

Ordered, That Messrs. Hurtt, Miller of Kent, and Gale report the same.

Mr. Dulany presented a petition of Francis Horner, widow of Doctor Gustavus Horner, of the Maryland line, praying for a pension, on account of the revolutionary services of her husband.

Which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.
