

to visit and inspect said road, and report to this House its condition;

Which having been twice read, the question was put, will the house adopt the same;

Determined in the negative.

The house took up for consideration the bill to authorise George W. Cummins and Jacob Raymond, administrators of John Cummins, deceased, of the State of Delaware, to remove into the said state a negro woman named Rachel, and to sell the same in said state, in which said negro woman the said John Cummins possessed an unexpired term, together with the amendment proposed by the committee on the colored population, to said bill.

The said amendment having been read a second time, was assented to.

The said bill was then read a second time as amended, and passed.

Mr. Hayne reported a bill, entitled, an act for the relief of Maria Cuff, a free woman of colour, of the city of Philadelphia;

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Moores reported a bill, entitled, an additional supplement to an act entitled, an act to authorise the Levy Courts of Baltimore and Harford counties to build a bridge over the Little Gunpowder falls, at Lee's mill, on the road leading from Baltimore to Bell-Air;

Which was read the first and second time by special order and passed.

Mr. Blakistone moved that the house adjourn, upon which motion the yeas and nays were ordered and appeared as follows:
