Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Jones of Somerst, also reported a bill, entitled, an act to authorise a public road and landing in Somerset county, and the construction of a bridge in said county.

Which was read the first and second time by special order.

When on motion by Mr. Handy, the said bill was amended by adding at the end thereof, the following additional section;—

*Sec. 8. And be it further enacted,* That any person who may conceive him or herself aggrieved by the proceedings of said commissioners, shall have the right of appeal to Somerset county court.

The said bill was then passed as amended.

The bill from the senate, entitled, an act relating to Poppleton street, in the city of Baltimore, was taken up for consideration, read the second time and passed.

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate The Merchant's Bank of Baltimore, was taken up for consideration.

When on motion of Mr. Nicols, the said bill was referred to the committee on ways and means.

On motion by Mr. Snowden, leave of absence was granted to Mr. Warfield, for a few days.

The bill reported by Mr. Wright of Dorchester, entitled an act to incorporate the Choptank Steam Boat Navigation Company of Maryland, was taken up for consideration, read the second time and passed.

The clerk of the senate returned the resolution relative to furnishing the Editors of Newspapers or public journals, with a copy of the printed journals of proceedings of both houses.

Also, the resolution authorising the Librarian to furnish certain laws, severally endorsed, "assented to."

Ordered to be engrossed.

And delivered a letter from George C. Wsshington, esquire, accepting of his appointment as a member of the Executive council.

Endorsed, referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

Which was read.

The House then adjourned until to-morrow morning 11 o'clock.
