

WEDNESDAY, January 15th, 1834.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Warfield who had leave of absence. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, An act to authorise a public road and landing in Somerset county, and the construction of a bridge in said county;

And, the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Chop-tank Steam Boat Navigation Company of Maryland;

Were sent to the senate.

The bill entitled, An act relating to Poppleton street, in the city of Baltimore, was returned to the senate.

Mr. Evans presented a petition of sundry citizens of Cecil county, praying the passage of a law to authorise the Commissioners of said county to levy a sum of money to build a bridge over the North East creek, at or near North East, in said county;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Evans, Maffitt and Thomas.

Mr. Peregoy presented a petition of the Washington Beneficial Society of Baltimore, praying for an act of incorporation;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Peregoy, Moores and Ely.

Mr. Lantz presented a petition of Reverend John Miller and Sarah his wife, praying a special law authorising them to convey certain real estate in Allegany county, to a certain Thomas C. Miller and Thomas J. Cooper of Adams county, Pennsylvania;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Lantz, Bruce and Berry.

Mr. Fountain presented a petition of Sarah Satterfield, wife of James Satterfield, praying for a divorce;

Which was read and referred to the committee on divorces.

Mr. Millar of Charles, presented a petition of Sarah Simmons, widow of Aaron Simmons, late of Charles county, a revolutionary soldier, praying to be placed on the pension list:

Which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Ely presented a petition of sundry citizens of Baltimore county, praying for an act to preserve the breed of Fish, in Bird river, and also to prevent the navigation of said river from being hereafter obstructed;
