In pursuance whereof, the Speaker appointed Messrs. Palmer and Spencer, on the said committee.

Mr. Carter of Montgomery, obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, an act, supplementary to an act entitled, An act, to distribute the School Fund, in Montgomery county.

Ordered, That Messrs. Carter of Montgomery, Gaither and Willson, report the same.

Mr. Ely obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, an act to prevent partiality in sales by Auction, of deceased persons estate.

Ordered, That Messrs. Ely, Bruff and Laveille, report the same.

Mr. Grove from the committee on the Colored Population, made an unfavorable report on the petition of Sally M. Martin, praying the passage of a law to authorise her to bring into this state, certain slaves therein mentioned; which having been read,

Mr. Blakistone offered as a substitute for said report, a bill, entitled, an act, for the benefit of Sally M. Martin.

Which was read.

On the question being put,

"Will the house adopt the substitute."

It was resolved in the affirmative.

The said bill was then read the first and second time by special order, and passed.
