The clerk of the Senate returned the bill entitled, An act to incorporate the Choptank Steam Boat, and navigation company of Maryland, endorsed will pass with the proposed amendment;

Which amendment was read the first and second time by special order, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed;

And, delivered a communication from Hector Humphreys, president, of Saint John's College, endorsed, "referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates;"

Which was read and referred to the committee on Education.

Mr. Dulany reported a bill entitled, An act for the relief of Thomas Gowen of the city of Baltimore;

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The House then adjourned until to morrow morning 11 o'clock.

SATURDAY, January 18th, 1834.

Mr. Humrickhouse presented a petition of Griffin Taylor, praying authority to bring into this state certain slaves therein mentioned;
