Ordered that the committee appointed to examine the Tobacco Inspection Warehouses in the City of Baltimore inquire into the expediency of having the crumbs or scraps of tobacco taken care of by the inspectors of said warehouses, packed and sold, the proceeds of said tobacco to be paid into the treasury of this state.

The house then adjourned, until to-morrow morning 11 o'clock.

FRIDAY, January 24th, 1834.

The House met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, an act to change the name of Elk Ridge Landing to that of Ashton;

The bill entitled, an act authorising the sale of land therein mentioned.

The resolution authorising the state librarian to purchase annually the usual supplies of stationary for the use of the Executive and Legislative departments, and

The resolution in favor of Henry Crook, a revolutionary soldier, were sent to the Senate.

The bill entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of the Cumberland Bank of Allegany, was returned to the Senate.
