

SATURDAY, January 25th, 1834.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, an act to extend the jurisdiction of justices of the peace in *Washington county*;

And, the message agreeing to close the session on the 22d of February next, were sent to the senate.

Mr. Peregoy presented a petition of Rolley Dunglison, Professor in the Faculty of physic, in the University of Maryland, praying for authority to introduce certain slaves in this state;

Which was read and referred to the committee on the coloured population.

Mr. Palmer presented a petition of Catharine Miller of Frederick county, praying for a divorce from her husband;

Which was read and referred to the committee on divorces;

Also, presented a petition of sundry citizens of Frederick county, praying for a law to authorise the Levy court of Frederick county if it shall be deemed expedient, to levy a sum of money not exceeding twelve hundred dollars, to build a bridge over Tom's creek, near the Town of Emmetsburg, in said county;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Palmer, Unkefer and Sifford.

Mr. Wharton presented a petition of George and Elizabeth Fouke and others, of Washington county, praying the passage of an act authorising a law case therein mentioned to be reinstated in the Court of Appeals of the western shore of Maryland;

Which was read and referred to the committee on greivances and courts of justice.

Mr. Jones, of Balt. city, presented a memorial of the mayor and city council of Baltimore, praying the passage of a law appropriating to the city of Baltimore its ratable proportion of the fund for the support of public education; in this state.

Which was read and referred to the committee on education.

Also, presented a petition of certain citizens of Baltimore, praying that the pay of the jurors attending Baltimore county court may be increased.

Also, presented a petition of William H. Marriott, and others, praying that the per diem allowance of the jurors in Baltimore county court may be increased;
