Which was read and referred to Messrs. Jones of Balt. city, Peregoy, Berry, Miller of Kent, and Price;

Also, presented a petition of Mary Ann Farrell, praying for a divorce a vinculo matrimonii;

Which was read and referred to the committee on divorces.

Mr. Hayne presented a petition of Samuel Merritt, and Arthur Merritt, of Kent county, praying for relief;
