Ordered, That Messrs. Carroll, Price and Ely, report same.

Mr. Millar of Charles obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, an act to make valid all deeds of conveyance executed or acknowledged in this state since the 23d February, 1831, which shall have been executed and acknowledged in conformity to the laws regulating such subjects prior to the said 23d of February, 1831;

Ordered that Messrs. Millar of Charles, Pratt and Evans report the same.

Mr. Palmer obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, an act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, passed at December session, 1805, chapter 110;

Ordered that Messrs. Palmer, Fassitt and Dulany report the same.

Mr. Palmer also obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, an act to extend the jurisdiction of justices of the peace in Frederick county, to one hundred dollars in all cases for money due on contracts, and for the breach of contracts for the non delivery of grain and other articles, and to give jurisdiction to justices of the peace in said county, in all actions of trespass with force, and all actions of trespass on the case sounding in tort, where the plaintiff does not demand a larger sum than fifty dollars;

Ordered that Messrs. Palmer, Unkefer and Sifford report the same.

Mr. Price, chairman of the select committee to which was referred the memorial of sundry citizens of Baltimore county, residing in the eleventh district thereof, praying that the place of holding the elections in said district may be changed; and also the petition of sundry citizens in the same district, counter thereto, made an unfavorable report thereon;

Which was read the first and second time by special order and concurred in.

Mr. Burchenal submitted the following resolution;
