

a bridge over the Monocacy river, passed at December session, 1828, chapter 67;

And the bill reported by Mr. Larrimore, entitled, an act to repeal part of an act passed at December session, 1824, chapter 167, authorising gates to be kept on the public roads in Queen Anne's county;

Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time and passed.

The bill reported by Mr. Thomas, entitled, an act for the relief of Robert Harris of Cecil county, was taken up for consideration;

When on motion by Mr. Thomas, said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the senate returned the resolution in favor of James Frazier, endorsed, "dissented from;"

And, delivered a resolution originated in and passed by the senate, relative to the riot among the laborers on the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal;

Which was read the first and second time by special order and assented to.

On motion by Mr. Spencer,

Ordered, That a committee of three persons be appointed by the chair to inquire into the expediency of reporting a bill, providing that all pensions granted since the 4th day of July, 1826, or which may hereafter be granted to officers and soldiers of the revolutionary war who served two or more years therein, shall take date from the above day, the jubilee of American Independence.

On motion by Mr. Moores, the said order was amended by striking out the word "three," and inserting in lieu thereof the word "five."

The question was then put, will the house adopt the order.

Resolved in the affirmative.

Whereupon the Speaker appointed Messrs. Spencer, Moores, Evans, Sifford and Hillen to constitute the said committee.

The house then adjourned until to-morrow morning ten o'clock.
