

WEDNESDAY, January 29th, 1834.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, an act to repeal part of an act passed at December session, 1824, chap. 167, authorising gates to be kept on the public roads, in Queen Anne's county;

The bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act, entitled, an act to authorise the Levy court of Frederick county to levy a sum of money to erect a bridge over the Monocacy river, passed at December session, 1828, chap. 67;

The bill entitled, an act to authorise Thomas E. Hambleton, Executor to make sale of real estate therein mentioned;

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Samuel P. Smith and Reuben Worthington, of Allegany county;

The bill entitled, an act to confirm an act entitled, an act to repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government as relates to the division of Washington county into seven Election Districts, and for other purposes, passed at December session, 1832, chap. 92;

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Edward W. Lyden, administrator of Shadrack Lyden, deceased, former Collector of taxes for Caroline county;

The resolution in favor of Ruth Griffith, &c.

The resolution authorising the Register of the Land Office for the western shore to transcribe a certain Record book, belonging to his office were sent to the senate;

The resolution relative to a riot among the laborers on the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal, was returned to the senate.

Mr. Schley presented a petition of the Westminster Taney Town and Emmittsburgh Turnpike company, praying for relief as therein expressed;

Which was read and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

Mr. Jones of Baltimore city, presented a petition of Isaac Smith Homans, of the city of Baltimore, praying a special act of insolvency;

Which was read and referred to the committee on insolvency.

Mr. Peregoy presented a memorial of Henry Stouffer and others, of the city of Baltimore, praying for an act to change the name of Dutch alley in said city, to Marion street;
