

Mr. Cushing, chairman of the select committee, to which was referred the bill from the senate, entitled, an act for the benefit of Alfred Y. Clagett and wife, reported the same without amendment;

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Ricaud reported a bill, entitled, an act to change the name of Nathaniel Hynson, jr. of Kent county, to that of Nathaniel Thornton Hynson;

And, Mr. Duvall reported a bill, entitled, an act for the re-valuation of the real and personal property in Frederick county;

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill reported by Mr. Kershner, entitled, an act authorising Henry Shafer, George Shafer, and Henry J. Shafer, to distribute their estate by lot, was taken up for consideration;

When, on motion of Mr. Jones of Baltimore, said bill was referred to the committee on lotteries.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, an act for the relief of Oramel Tower and Matthew Scott, endorsed, "will pass," ordered to be engrossed;

Also, the resolution in favor of William Welch, endorsed, "assented to," ordered to be engrossed.

And, delivered a bill, originated in and passed by the senate, entitled, an act for the relief of Thomas B. Waterman;

Which was read and referred to the committee on insolvency.

Also, a letter from Gwynn Harris, Esq. accepting of his appointment as a member of the Executive Council;

Which was read.

The bill reported by Mr. Jones of Baltimore, entitled, an act to incorporate the Harmony Beneficial Society of Baltimore, was taken up for consideration;

On motion of Mr. Jones of Baltimore, said bill was amended by adding, as the sixth section of the bill, the following:

Sec. 6. "*And be it enacted*, That nothing in this act shall be so construed as to authorise the said corporation to issue or put in circulation, any negotiable note or notes, or notes payable to bearer, or notes in the nature of a bank note.

The said bill was then read the second time, as amended, passed, and sent to the senate.
