

Mr. Beall also presented a petition of sundry citizens of Allegany county, praying that the act of December session, 1833, chapter 175, may be revived and amended;

Which were severally read and referred to Messrs. Beall, Devoindon, and McMahan.

Mr. Moores presented a petition of Elizabeth Parsons, of Harford county, praying to be placed on the pension roll of said county;

Which was read and referred to the committee on pensions to indigent persons by county assessment;

And, Mr. Carter presented a petition of sundry citizens of Denton, in Caroline county, praying the passage of a law authorising the drawing of a lottery, to raise the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars, for the benefit of Denton Academy, and for other purposes therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to the committee on lotteries.

Mr. Hughes obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, a further supplement to an act, relating to the people of color in this State, passed at December session, 1831, chapter 281;

Ordered, That Messrs. Hughes, Dudley, and Welty, report the same.

Mr. Kent of Anne Arundel, obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, an act to authorise the commissioners for Anne Arundel county, to sell certain property therein mentioned;

Ordered, That Messrs. Kent of Anne Arundel, Iglehart, and Hood, report the same.

Mr. Burchenal submitted the following message,

By the House of Delegates,
January 26, 1835.

Gentlemen of the Senate:

The state of the public Treasury calling loudly for retrenchment in every department of the State Government, and believing that we ought to get through the business of the Session, by the 28th of February next, we propose, with the consent of your honorable body to adjourn *sine die*, on the aforesaid day, provided we shall not be ready to adjourn before said day.
