That your Committee find by a Report in January 1778, it appears, that the sum of £79-17-2 Gold Currency was then due from the Collector of the Land Tax in Queen Anne's County, for the half Year ending the 29th Day of September 1763 and that the said sum hath not yet been paid. Your Committee further take leave to report, that from the Multiplicity of Business, the Nature of the Trust, and the Care and Regularity of the Disbursements, they are of Opinion that the Commissions and Fees Annual Salaries have been very inadequate to the Service they have rendered the public. All which is submitted to the Consideration of the honourable Assembly, this 21st Day of December 1779

Strike out from the word "of," in the nineteenth Line of the third Page, to the word "and," in the Eighteenth Line of said Page, and insert the words "thirty Pounds Currency". Strike out the words "twenty five Pounds
