On Motion, leave given to bring in a Bill to encrease the Allowance of Justices of the Peace, and Jurymen; and a Bill to encrease the Allowance of Witnesses and the fees of Constables. Ordered That Mr. McMechin and Mr. Lethbrun do prepare & bring in the same.
