

Ordered, That Col^o Smallwoods be requested to detach a non-Commissioned Officer and two privates, to guard the Arms directed to be sent to Capt^t Regm Beall.

Ordered, That Col^o John Hall of Cumberland County be requested to detach part of a Company of Militia in his Battalion to guard and watch the Coast from Thomas's point to Horn-point.

Copy of Letter No. 45. was sent to Capt^t Regm Beall by Mr. 26 to Jese Hollingsworth of Balt^t Town.

The Brig Fortune Chartered by Mr. William Lewis, and the Brig Rogers chartered by Mr. George Woolsey, having remained some time in the Harbour laden with Flour and bread belonging to this Province, and no probability of their getting to their port of Delivery, by reason of Men of War and Tenders infesting the bay, and their Cargoes being in Danger of becoming altogether spoiled and of no value.

It is therefore Ordered by the Council of Safety, that the said vessels be unladen, and their Cargoes delivered to Mr. Jese Hollingsworth, to whom written directions are given, how to dispose of the same, and that the said vessels be discharged from the Public Service.

Commissions issued to Rich^d Gresham app^t Third Lieutenant of Captain Thomas Smyth's Company of Militia of light infantry in Kent County, belonging to the 13th Battalion.

Ordered. That Captain James Nicholsons be empowered to purchase Salt Beef and Pork for the use of the Ships crew belonging to the Defence.

Ordered. That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Jese Hollingsworth four hundred and nine pounds thirteen shillings and nine pence, for expenses incurred in raising and refitting the vessels sunk at Whetstone point, for the defence of Baltimore Town.

Ordered. That said Treasurer pay unto Daniel Adams seventy one pounds seventeen shillings and six pence, for detention of schooner Hawk and wages for his Seamen, she being one of the app^t vessels, that were sunk.

Ordered. That the said Treasurer pay to Seth Paddock eighty eight pounds five shillings, and seven pence half penny, for wages and detention of Sloop Mayflower she being one of the vessels sunk for the preservation of Baltimore Town.

Ordered. That said Treasurer pay to Daniel Adams, according to the direction of the Convention, one hundred and fifty four pounds, fifteen shillings for Flour purchased by him to ship on board the schooner Hawk for service.

Ordered. That said Treasurer pay to Manlock Palfrey, according to the direction of the Convention, two hundred, and ten pounds, one shilling and nine pence for Flour purchased as above of Invoice.

Ordered That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the said Manlock Palfrey, the further sum of two hundred and ten pounds seven shillings and one Penny for Flour by him purchased for the purpose mentioned in the preceding Order.

Ordered that said Treasurer pay to Cumberland Pagan one hundred
