Ordered That Thomas Yates be appointed Captain of a Company of Militia to be raised in Kenton County, for the Flying Camps in the Town of Lexington, persons who resigned.

Ordered That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Capt Yates nine Pounds fifteen Shillings his first Lieutenant Edward Ogilby Esq. Second Lieut John Ogilby Esq. and Ensign Joseph Lewis £34.5.

Ordered That the said Treasurer pay to Charles Williams Esq. Esquire, One thousand Pounds.

Commissions issued to John Kidd, John Hancock Esquires and Alexander Forbush appointed first Lieutenants in Col Smallwoods Battalion of Regulars.

In Detachment Benjamin Chambers, Henry Chew Peter Nelson Bridgely & Edward Prank appointed second Lieutenants.

In Walter House appointed third Lieutenant.

And to Walter Brookes Esq. James Ferris Esq. Peter Brown Esq. Capeway and William Cousts appointed independent Detachment.

Ordered That the Resolve of Convention requesting the Militia Officers in the Flying Camps be immediately published in the Maryland Gazette, and 200 Hand Bills of the same printed to be circulated through the Province.

Adjourned till next day 10 o'clock.
