Baltimore County.

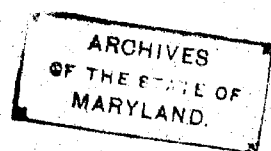
Ordered That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the Officers of each
of the said Companies eight hundred and sixty Dollars for Bounty Money
for their respective Companies, in the following proportions to wit:

To each Captain three hundred Dollars, to each Lieutenant two
hundred Dollars and to each Ensign one hundred and sixty Dollars.

Adjourned till next Day 10 o'clock.

Saturday 13th July 1770.

Council met. Present as yesterday.



Ordered. That Copies of the Letter received from the President
of the Congress, of the 8th Inst. be sent to the several Committees of Observation
in each County and District in this Province respectively.

Order that Warrants issue agreeable to the Recommendation of the
Committee of Observation for Harford County, to the following persons to Command
the Rifle Company to be raised there, to wit:

Ordered That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Capt. Smith
300 Dollars, to the first Second Lieutenant, 200 Dollars each, and to the
Ensign One hundred and fifty Dollars to be advanced as a Bounty to
the said Company.

Ordered That the said Treasurer pay Capt. John Allen Thomas
fifty pounds Continental Currency to defray the Expenses of his March to
Philadelphia.

Ordered, That the paymaster advance to Capt. Thomas's
Company half a months pay.

Copy of Letter N^o 32 was sent to the Deputies of this Province in
Congress.

Adjourned till 3 o'clock, and met accordingly.

Ordered that Col. Robert Tyler march a Company out of his Battalion
of Militia, to the City of Annapolis by Tuesday evening next, and take care
that they come well armed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Col. Thomas
Ewing two hundred pounds on account of the lower Battalion of Militia
for the Flying Camp.

Copies of Letter N^o 33. was sent to the Committees of Observation for
St. Mary's, Charles, Calvert and Prince Georges Counties.
