



*The Copsy of a Letter intended for his
Highnesse.*

May it please your Highnesse :

HAVING formerly had the honour to relate to your Highnesse not only in your Army, but also as a domestick servant, I humbly thought it my duty to give your Highnesse a true relation of the late disaster of this Countrey, which although it be not a place any way considerable or worth your Highnesse trouble, yet when I consider the great care and pains your Highnesse hath formerly taken both below your selfe, and almost incredible to those that have not been eye-witnesses of them, for the true setting of Government, and avoyding the needless shedding of bloud, it gives encouragement to my pen, and assures me that the score upon which I write, will obtain a pardon of your Highnesse for my presumption, it being humbly and in the name of that great God (whom I know had not your Highnesse feared would never have so palpably helpt your Highnesse in your greatest necessity, and fought your Battels) to beg a boon which will I doubt not, absolutely end the needless shedding of bloud in this part of the world, in regard now both parties pretend to fight for your Highnesse: My Lord, my humble Petition to your Highnesse is, that your Highnesse would be pleased graciously to condescend so low as to settle the Countrey, so as wee may beere understand the absolute pleasure and determinate will of your Highnesse therein,
