rendered incapable to carry on his business or occupation, or hath, by means of the enemy, lost his negroes, has his houses burned, or otherwise greatly full red, the commissioners of the tax may, in their discretion, direct the collector to suspend the collection of the assessment, on the gross valuation by the .ass sfor of the property taken away or destroyed by the en my, until the general affembly shall take order there n; and the commissioners are required to return to the seneral affembly a lift of fuch suspensions, and the cauf's and proofs for which the same were made. And be it enocked, Thut, five lensible, discreet and experienced persons, shall be appointed in each counsy of this state, who shall be called commissioners of the tax, and they, or any three or more of them, shall be the commissioners for each county; provided that no member of the general affembly or the council, clergyman, practifing attoriey or physician, sheriff, clerk of the general or any county court, ordinary keeper, mariner, or inspector, shall be appointed a committion: r or affestor.

And Me it enaded, That the following persons shall be and are hereby appointed commissioners for the several and respective counties of this state, to wit: For Sa nt Mary's county, Messieurs Ignatius Fenwick, Robert Watts, John De Butts, Jeremiah Jordan, and Robert Chessey; for Kent county, Messieurs James M'Lane, Robert Crookshanks, William Granger, Nathaniel Contegyes, and Oliver Smith; for Anne-Arundel county, Messieurs John Weems, Charles Wallace, John Brice, William Hall, and Edward Gaiter, junior; for Calvert county, Messieurs Alexansel, der Someruille, Daniel Rawlings, Thomas Blake, Joseph Wilkin son, and Thomas Mackall; for Charles county, Messieurs Josias Hawkins, Richard Barnes, housert Young, Thomas Harris, and Henry Barnes, for Baltimon; county, Messieurs Andrew Buchanan, Archibald
