You must keep more cattle, make more milk and butter, and as a natural sequence more manure, which is the best capital.— Instead of pasturing, you must soil the cattle—that is give them their green food in the stalls instead of in the field. If you raise wheat you must get from thirty-five to forty bushels to the aere; if corn, from seventy-five to ninety bushels per acre; if oats, seventy-five bushels—and so on. You must have a full supply of ruta-bagas and sugar-beets for your dairy cattle in winter, and carrots for your horses. You must have your acres of strawberries, raspberries and blackberries to catch the early markets. You must have your tee apple-

have your acres of strawberries, raspberries and blackberries to catch the early markets. You must have your two appleorchards—a young one always coming on—and your pear orchard of the best standard varieties. You should also raise the most saleable and productive beans by the acro. Drive Wells. A correspondent furnishes Hearth and Home with the following on Drive Wells, Home with the following on Drive Wells, which is worth knowing:

There are many drive-wells in this vicinity. They are made by driving 1½ inch galvanized iron pipe down to the stratum where water is found. The pipe is then cut off at the desired height, and a cistorn-pump screwed to the top of it. The first joint of pipe is prepared for driving by screwing a solid iron plug into one end.—
The plug extends six inches or so, and is drawn to a point. Just above the plug the pipe is perforated with small holes enceighth of an inch in diameter, in sufficient number to fill it with water. The pipe is held securely in a perpendicular position,

number to fill it with water. The pipe is held securely in a perpendicular position, and driven with a maul or sledge—precaution being taken against bruising the end by using a block of hard wood or a piece of solid iron screwed into it to receive the stroke. The pump is occasionally attached to the result of the pump is occasionally attached stroke. The pump is occasionally attached to try for water as the work progresses.— When water is reached, the pump is operated until the sand at the foot of the pipe is extracted, leaving a chamber or reservoir. The pump must have a 'sand valve'—a valve closing upon a sharp edge instead of a flat surface, which leaves no resting place for sand beneath it. Ordinary iron pipe (gas-pipe) is sometimes used, but the galvanized is preferred, being free from corrosion.

vanized is preferred, being free from corrosion.

"The 'drive-well' is preticable where water may be found in a gracelly *vib*vil, at a depth of twenty-five to thirty feet or less, and where the pipe may be driven without coming in contact with large or fixed stones. (If the pipe should terminate in compact clay, it could not be pumped out to form a reservoir; if in quick-sand, the sand could not be exhausted, but, terminating in a bed of sand and gravel, the sand is readily drawn, leaving the gravel about the end of bed of sand and gravel, the sand is readily drawn, leaving the gravel about the end of the pipe to secure as a reservoir and filter.)
"Some of these wells, after the first pumping, continue to give an abundant supply of pure water; others raise sand freedently or continually—probably owing to the caving-in of the cavity, and not enough gravel to make a perfect illter—They are much used here for obtaining a convenient supply of water for mortarmaking at new buildings—being driven wherever desired and drawn when the work is done.

If this were carefully saved by peat absorbents, kept under the stable, or in it, it would double the pile, or be equal to twenty-four cords of good compost. If this were spread upon two acres of rundown meadow, producing a ton of hay or less per acre, it would increase the crop probably to three tons to the acre the first year, and the effects of it would be seen in increased erops for five years longer.—In those two acres it would make all the difference between profitable and unprofit albertaming for five years. This compost, if sold in many good farming districts, would bring \$4 per cord or \$90\$. Used on the meadow it would produce much more in successive crops of hay. 


